Toulouse in Numbers:
An Incredible Meeting in the Pink City

From 2 to 4 April 2025, over 980 paediatric orthopaedic professionals gathered in Toulouse, France, for the 43rd EPOS Annual Meeting – a vibrant celebration of research, learning, and international collaboration. Known as La Ville Rose, Toulouse proved to be the perfect setting for three unforgettable days of science, exchange and inspiration.

Congress Highlights:

- 981 participants from 68 countries, representing all continents
- 28 scientific sessions, showcasing cutting-edge research across the full spectrum of paediatric orthopaedics
- 11 major sponsors and 11 exhibitors supporting innovation and knowledge-sharing
- 42 best papers selected across hip, spine, trauma, sports, neuromuscular, foot & ankle, and lower limb deformity – of which 6 received the "Best of the Best" award

JCO Impact Factor Reaches New Heights



We are pleased to share that the **Journal of Children's Orthopaedics** (**JCO**) has achieved a **2024 Impact Factor of 1.6**, exceeding projections and reinforcing its position as a leading publication in our field.

Ranking in the 2024 Journal Citation Reports:

- 78/139 in Orthopaedics (Q3)
- 91/191 in *Paediatrics* (Q2)

This places JCO ahead of several comparable titles, including the *Journal of Pediatric Orthopaedics* (IF 1.5).

We thank Prof. Fritz Hefti and Prof. Shlomo Wientroub, Editors-in-Chief, for their outstanding leadership, and our publishing partner SAGE for their continued support.

A notable update to this year's metrics: citations to or from retracted content are now excluded from the calculation. This change, though limited in impact (affecting just 0.4% of total citations), helps ensure greater integrity in bibliometric data.
