Required Documentation

Dear Prospective FEPOS Fellow,

Thank you for your interest in the European Paediatric Orthopaedic Society (EPOS) Fellowship program. To ensure a comprehensive evaluation of your candidacy, please include the following documentation with your application:

1. Curriculum Vitae (CV): Provide a full CV, including a colour passport photograph. Your CV should reflect your previous experience in Paediatric Orthopaedics.
2. Personal Statement: Submit a statement (maximum 250 words) explaining your reasons for applying to the FEPOS Fellowship.
3. Two Letters of Support: Include two letters supporting your application. One letter must be from your local training program director, and the other must be from a recent clinical supervisor (preferably, working in the field of paediatric orthopaedics).
4. **Optional** : Letter of Returning Centre: If you have a job offer at a centre upon completion of the FEPOS program, include a letter from the future centre stating that you have a job offer.

Initial selection will be based on the documentation submitted. Shortlisted candidates will be invited for an interview.

Working Requirements:

Specific Required Documentation to apply to this position:

- Language Requirements: Candidates must be fluent in French on an academic level.
- Work Permit Regulations for the position, follow EC guidelines.

To be eligible for the fellowship, you must have completed a training program in Orthopaedic Surgery from your country of origin. In certain circumstances, a formal training in Paediatric Surgery may be accepted, provided you have completed an adequate training in Paediatric Orthopaedics and submit documented proof of it.

Please ensure that your application package is complete and submitted by the specified deadline. Incomplete or late applications may not be considered.
